2007 4-POSITION JUNIOR SECTIONAL

The 2007 NRA 4-Position Smallbore Junior Sectional was held at the Alexandria Sportsmen Club in Alexandria, PA on February 3rd and 4th, 2007. 38 Junior competitors vied for the Sectional Crown. Tom Santelli (Frazier-Simplex Rifle Club, Washington, PA) won the Gold Medal with a new National Record score of 400-37X. Santelli went on to shoot two extra tens to capture the new Junior National Record. Joel Nuzum, also from Frazier-Simplex, garnered the Silver Medal with a fine score of 397-32X. Michael Kulbacki (Dubois Storm Jr. Rifle Club, Dubois, PA) won the Bronze Medal by shooting a 396-29X.

The Junior Class was won by Justin Pentz (Rockton, PA) with a score of 394-31X. Second Junior was Adam Weaver (Midway, PA) with a score of 393-30X. Christina Dutra (Grampian, PA) shot a 395-29X to

win the Intermediate Junior Class. David Sloan (Huntingdon, PA) took second Intermediate Junior, shooting a 395-26X. Emily Holsopple of Wilcox, PA took third place IJ (394-25X). Aaron Holsopple shot a 390-23x to take fourth IJ. Nikki Kroll (a Sub Junior from Lowber, PA) shot a 383-14X to take the Sub Junior Class. Ethan Marne (Murrysville Junior Rifle Club, Mt. Pleasant, PA) took Second Sub Junior (379-19X). Mike Shannon of Dauphin, PA (Capital Area Rifle Team) won the Third Sub Junior award with a score of 355-7X.

We had 20 Intermediate Juniors and 10 Sub Juniors in this tournament. This is a good looking future for Junior Shooting in Pennsylvania!

Vying for the Sectional Team Title were six teams. Frazier-Simplex Junior Rifle Team (Washington, PA) captured the Team Gold medal with a fine score of 1578-122X, just two points off the National Record. Team Members: Tom Santelli (400-37X), Joel Nuzum (397-32X), Adam Weaver (393-30X), and Jasmine Margaria (388-23X).

The Dubois Storm Jr. Team (Christina Dutra, Aaron Holsopple, Justin Pentz, and Michael Kulbacki) won the Junior Medal with a close 1575-112X. The Second Junior Team was the Alexandria Jr. Rifle Team shooting a 1548-78X; shooting members were David Sloan, George Peters, Nicole Harpster, and Tanya Kocker. Third Junior Team was Lara Gingrich, Timothy Davis, Jordan Lehman, and Ellen Gingrich from the Mechanicsburg Sportsman near Harrisburg, PA. The Winning Intermediate Junior Team was the Capital Area Rifle Team, also from the Harrisburg area; the team (Elizabeth Embeck, Jared Taylor, Amanda Stockton, and Michael Shannon) shot a 1484-51X. The Intermediate Junior Team from Everett, PA (Shane Arnold, Ross Horton, Ryan Mueller, and Liza Mearkle) shot a 1391-35 to capture the second Intermediate Junior Spot.

The Alexandria Rifle Club would like to thank the National Rifle Association, and the shooters, parents, and coaches for the chance to host this historic event. The National Record that Thomas Santelli shot will be a memory for all of us to remember forever. I would like to thank our Club volunteers for helping to put this event on.

SUMMER SHOOTING CAMP -- INDIANA UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA

An Intermediate Level NRA Smallbore Rifle Camp is planned for June 19-24, 2007. This is a competition type camp focusing on 3-Position Smallbore events. Juniors between the age of 11 and 18 are welcome to apply. Intermediate level shooting experience is defined as having previous shooting activity, such as high school rifle team, NRA Junior shooting club or programs, 4-H shooting programs, or other organized, adult run shooting programs. Intermediate means being ready for more advanced position work, additional competitive experience, and perhaps different coaching than may have received before this camp. Juniors are to bring their own shooting equipment, i.e. shooting coat, sling, glove, spotting scope, shooting mat, .22 match rifle, and other miscellaneous equipment used in competitive shooting.

The staff are all volunteers and include a wide range of experienced coaches. Many are highly experienced competitors. IUP provides dormitory rooms and dining facility meals. Local transportation is provided between ranges and university facilities. Adults maintain 24 hour supervision of all juniors. Juniors are expected to attend for the duration of instruction and shooting competition. Targets, instructional materials, and some .22 ammunition are provided. The registration is \$175. Participants arrive on Tuesday afternoon, 19 June, are involved in four full days of shooting activities, 20-23 June, and depart at approximately noon on Sunday, 24 June.

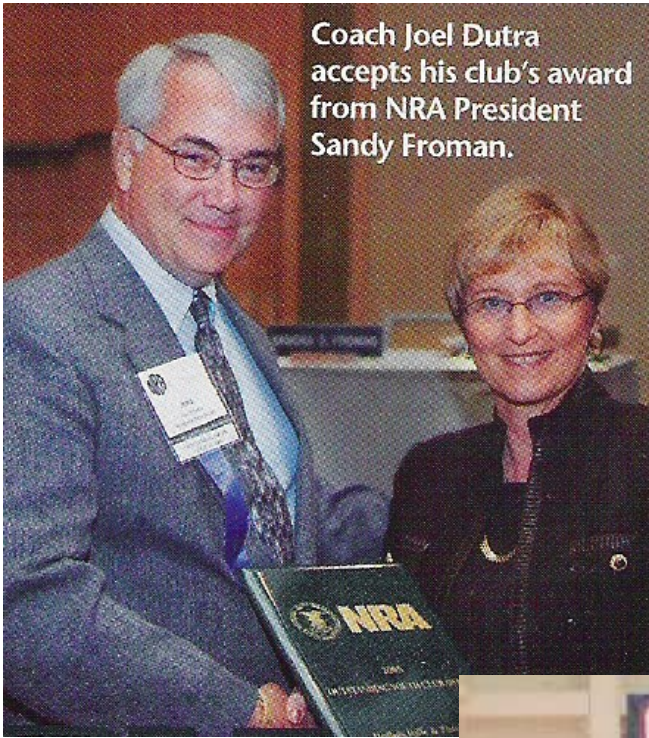

DuBOIS WINS NRA OUTSTANDING YOUTH CLUB AWARD

The National Rifle Association's National Awards for the year 2005 were presented at a special ceremony on September 16, 2006 in Arlington, Virginia. NRA President Sandy Froman presided.

The DuBois Rifle & Pistol Club was awarded the 2005 NRA Outstanding Youth Club Award. The Pennsylvania club was given the honor for keeping youth competitive shooting alive and strong in the Keystone State.

In conjunction with the DuBois Area High School, the DuBois Rifle & Pistol Club formed a junior rifle team that has approximately 30 members. The club is responsible for financial support of this high school team and coaching for at least three years. Team members actively shoot smallbore and three-position air rifle. The team travels all year for competitions in Junior Olympic Championships, the National Smallbore competition at Camp Perry and various regional and local matches.

Junior team members are required to take the NRA Basic Rifle course every year. A number of team members have earned college scholarships or received appointments at various US Military Academies.

The DuBois Rifle & Pistol Club also runs several safety programs with various organizations in the state. The club works closely with the Pennsylvania Rifle & Pistol Association in many aspects, requiring all junior competition shooters to be members of PRPA.



The NRA National Awards Program recognizes outstanding service of those who support the NRA in areas such as legislative affairs, club operations, youth programs, fundraising and others. Individuals and groups who are honored exemplify the diverse character of the Association.

This year 16 awards were given. "It's important to recognize the people and organizations who have distinguished themselves through dedication and commitment to the NRA," said Sandy Froman. "These people have made a unique commitment to the gun-owning public across America and their willingness to give of themselves speaks tremendously of their character."

ATTITUDE IS EVERYTHING

Gliding through the sea on her surfboard, Bethany Hamilton searched for the next wave she'd ride to shore. Without warning, a shark came up and bit off her arm, sending shock, fear, and panic piercing into everyone around her—but not Bethany. Bethany looked at her friends and wondered why they were upset. She was aware of the problem, but remained unbelievably calm, swam to shore and got help. Why was Bethany so calm in the face of such a horrific situation?

A similar situation occurred in the Amazon jungle. A doctor was approached by a boy for help. His arm was partially amputated and yet he climbed and crawled through miles of jungle to get to the doctor without a trace of panic. In this situation, the doctor immediately went to give the boy a shot of Novocain and the boy screamed from the prick of the needle. Why hadn't he screamed over the much larger injury that almost certainly gave him more pain?

Our brains are amazing. In a panic situation, where we are injured, it shifts into survival mode. After the initial pain, our brain already knows that our body is hurt and needs attention. To let the pain continue would only hinder our ability to seek help or help ourselves. The reason why the little boy was so aware of the tiny pain from the needle was because it was a new sort of pain. His brain was alerting him once again to be aware that something wasn't quite right.

Now take a different situation. You're at World Championships. You've been training very hard for this. You're into standing and you're shooting decently. Things are going fairly smoothly. BAM! The screen flashes 6! You're shocked! You think, "I haven't done a shot like that in a very long time, and I do it in *World Championships*?" How do you respond?

Or take another situation, much less dramatic but equally as significant. Again, you're on the line at World Championships, but this time it's prone competition. You're shooting you're shots one by one, it's not too bad, but you're aware of something. You have this low underlying buzz, like a mosquito flying around your head whispering, "*Something's not right.*" But you can't put your finger on it for almost the whole match. Then you put your finger on it—literally. Your trigger's malfunctioning and has been intermittently the entire match. It's not over yet. You have 19 shots left. What do you do?

As shooters, we experience situations both mentally and emotionally challenging and there is no automatic "survival mode" that our brains can just kick into with ease. In both these situations it is critically important how we handle them. That makes all the difference between a good performance and one that we might as well not even shoot. When we shoot a bad shot, we may very well feel like we've just been attacked by a shark, caught off our guard, not sure what the next move should be. Do we let panic set in? Do we embrace the adrenaline and let our body race as much as our mind? Do our minds immediately flood with negative thoughts, seeking to blame something. The heat, the range, ourselves...

Or is the problem less pronounced. The match isn't going as you thought it might. You try everything you know, but the needle prick of less-than-perfect shots is telling you to be aware that something isn't right. You check everything you know to check, and still the problem stays. You're time is running out, you have to keep going. What happens to you at this point? Do you get frustrated and mentally give up, throwing shots indiscriminately down range? If and when you realize the culprit, what's your next move?

The previous two shooting situations happened to me while I shot in the World Championships this summer. Both were unexpected, but not improbable or unforeseeable.

Going into a match its good to have a thorough plan, but not a rigid one. This means that you should think about situations that could occur in the match both good and bad, and what your plan will be in those cases. Your plan should be like a tree. If you just have one rigid stump of a plan, if something goes wrong you have nowhere to go. You should have a main plan, with specific alternate plans branching off in case you need them.

But, the most important thing is how you handle initial disappointment or even panic. If you let it overcome you, then no plan in the world will save you. During my matches I knew this was critical and I'm not one to easily let negative talk or panic take over. I kept talking positively and trusting myself, and knew that one simple shot did not define me. In prone, I became aware of the trigger problem, knew I couldn't have it fixed and finish the match in time, figured out how I could work with the trigger to finish the match and decided that I'd finish strong. 19 shots left. 19 shots fired. 19 tens recorded.



The bottom line is: Let nothing shake you. You can't control what's already happened, but you can control how you react to it. Don't let the past define you. You are defined by your future.

You know what Bethany Hamilton is doing right now? She's surfing. With one arm, she's adapted and surfs without fear of the past. Did she foresee that the shark would bite her? Of course not. Was it improbable? No, sharks occasionally bite surfers. But when it happened, it was *certainly* unexpected! Yet, Bethany followed an alternate plan, and she keeps surfing, even training for competitions. Maybe she'll win a championship one day; she definitely has the attitude for it.

Kirsten Weiss is a Palmyra Jr. Rifle team Alumnus, who is currently a junior in college competing with the University of Nebraska rifle team. She is also on the National Development Team and competed in tournaments across the country. She made her international debut in Bisley, England at the Junior Invitational where she won a Gold medal in the junior women's 3-Position event as well as several team medals.
